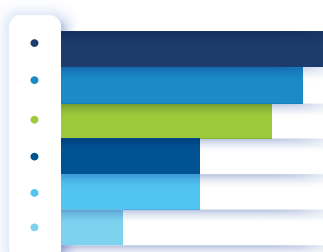

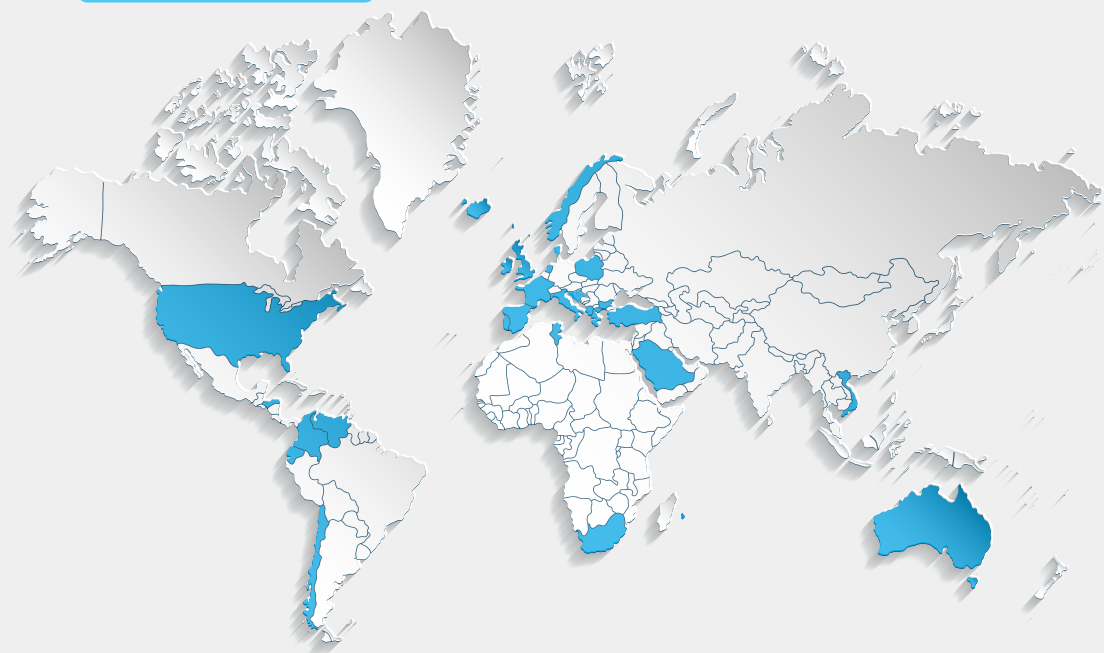

Making responsible farming visible to consumers

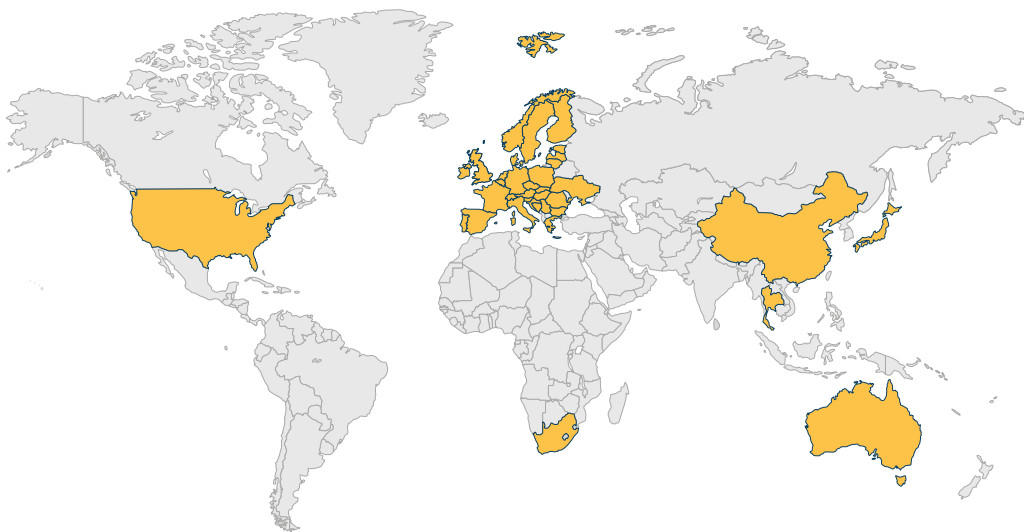
